

In the last few months the Council has been working with the Kansas District of the LCMS to adjust our constitution for their lawyers (we receive our non-profit church status through them). The Council brought the proposed adjustments to the Congregational Assembly and it was unanimously decided to approve them. As such, we now have an officially approved constitution that works for all parties involved. Additionally, under Kevin's lead, the Council is excited for our new experiment with VBS this summer (see more details on the next page). We are urging everyone who is present for worship on Sunday mornings in June to stick around for our two hour VBS that will immediately follow. We want our youth to see first hand how important time with Jesus is through the example and modeling of our adults. So stick around and help out with a task or just hang out and start to build relationships with some of the youth you don't know very well. Finally, if you haven't already, please reach out to Pastor Luke if you still want to receive your newsletter through a physical mailing. Our goal is to minimize any mailing and printing waste with our current methods of distributing the newsletter. Disciple Garden Corner

It has finally come...the day we have permission to begin pulling construction permits! We finally received approval for every last, tiny detail from the city and state for the Disciple Garden project. Now we move into the season of waiting on contractors to fit us into their construction schedules. Our first construction projects will be sewer, water, and electrical infrastructure as well as getting the foundation and structure of the main building in place. Then we will move on to finishing the interior of the main building and getting the driveway and parking area in place. Finally we will have to put sidewalks in place along 10th Street as the city is requiring that of us. We are excited to finally get ground breaking underway and transition our waiting into a new phase.

In the meantime, the Lord has put a possible opportunity before us. The south boundary of the Disciple Garden is a series of five houses on Brown Avenue. One of these houses is potentially for sale (1008 Brown Ave) and the congregation has given the Council the authority to explore and possibly purchase this home. Such a purchase might be a faster, cheaper, and less disruptive way to expand our Disciple Garden community. It would also allow our Disciple Garden caretakers to begin living on site sooner, rather than later. Please pray for the Lord's will to be done.

Community Ministry Corner -- VBS!!!

Out comes the Resurrected Lamb of *April* Easter, *May* we now prepare our resurrected hearts for the **ROAR** (VBS theme 2019) of *June*. A new VBS (vacation Bible school) format begins this June 2 and each of the 5 Sundays of June 2019 at St. Luke's. Your Steward will be contacting you in May as to the Sunday selected for your steward group to be present and accountable for VBS in light support/participation as we explore the five VBS Bible themes of 2019.

Rather than a week of evenings traditionally in June at St. Luke's, we will use Bible study hour after church each Sunday in June for our kid (and now adult) VBS experience. All the normal leads of VBS are in place (Chef Janice, Game Guy Dave, Crafty Marie, Lyrical Lisa, Literal Bible Lesson Luke, Kevin with one child group, Julie with the second child group) and their support staff. We want to invite our entire community at St. Luke's to continue to live into "Deeper Discipleship and Closer Community" with the 2 hour VBS (from 11:00 am to 1:00 pm) each Sunday of June. Children will be divided into 2 groups and you can loosely join in anywhere on campus as the youth journey from station to station. It's as easy as 1) Bible focus, 2) crafts, 3) hearty snack and games, 4) songs/skit, and out the door (before 1:00 pm). Snacks will be enough food to keep our mass of kids and adults comfortable through our full morning into early afternoon together.

If you are on vacation the Sunday your Steward selects, having a family get together or a hot lunch date, no worries, no stress--enjoy your Sundays wherever they find you. However, we would love for you to attend all of the five Sundays (or at least any you are in town for). Thank you in advance for being a support in our intentional efforts to talk and live the truth of Jesus in the company of all generations of Jesus's followers at St. Luke's. We will watch our youth enjoy and be challenged after church each of these five June Sunday mornings. This will take the place of Pastor's Bible Study hour for the month of June.

Galatians Bible Study


