Baptism — The Way of Faith

The Creator wants to save all of his creation from Civilization.

✤ So the Creator is calling me to let go of the Way of Civilization and become a lifelong disciple who follows the Way of Jesus.

Only the Creator can accomplish this through his sacraments.

★ daily destroys my old life in the Way of Civilization, forgives and releases me from it, and resurrects me into a new life on the Way of Jesus.

✤ I receive the Creator's work of Baptism through Faith.
