

Trumpet 6: The Angels of Judgment Are Released (The Second Woe)

¹³ The sixth angel blew his trumpet and I heard a voice from the horns of the gold altar in front of the Creator (1 Kgs 1:50-53; Psa 18:2-3; Amos 3:14-15; Rev 6:9, 8:3). ¹⁴ The voice was saying to the sixth angel which had a trumpet,

“Free the four angels who have been bound near the Great Euphrates River—the *birthplace of Civilization* (Gen 4:16; Isa 7:20, 8:7; Jer 51:60-64; Dan 7:2-3; Rev 7:1-2)!”

¹⁵ The four angels who had been prepared for this hour, day, month, and year, were freed to kill a third of the humans (Rev 3:3, 3:10, 8:1, 8:7-12). ¹⁶ I heard that there was a *spiritual* army of two myriads of myriads of soldiers on horses—*ready to conquer* (Psa 33:17; Isa 31:1-3; Jer 46:9-10, 50:41-42; Ezek 26:7-14; Hab 1:5-11; Rev 5:11, 9:7-9). ¹⁷ In this way I saw the horses in my vision and those sitting upon them (Rev 6:1-8, 9:7). They had fire-red, sapphire-blue, and sulfur-yellow breastplates, the heads of the horses were like a lion, and from their mouths came fire, smoke, and sulfur—*burning, suffocating, and corrosive teachings* (Gen 19:24; Deut 29:23; Psa 11:5-6; Prov 20:2; Isa 5:26-30; Ezek 23:6, 38:4-23). ¹⁸ A third of humans were killed by these three plagues of *burning, suffocating, and corrosive teachings* (Rev 1:16, 2:16). ¹⁹ For the authority and hurtfulness of the horses is in their mouths—their *teachings*—and in their tails which are like serpents having heads—*deceptive and venomous false prophecies* (Gen 3:1-14; Num 21:6-9; Psa 140:1-4; Isa 9:14-16; Jer 8:16-17; Amos 5:19; Rev 6:8, 9:3, 9:10). ²⁰ The remaining humans, who were not killed by these three plagues, did not repent from the practices of their hands (Rev 2:21). They did not stop bowing down to demons and things made of gold, silver, bronze, stone, and wood, which are not able to see, hear, or walk (Deut 4:28, 31:29; Psa 115:4-8, 135:15-18; Isa 2:7-8, 44:9-20; Jer 1:16, 8:4-7, 10:1-16; Dan 5:22-23; Hab 2:18-19; Rev 8:11). ²¹ They did not repent from their killings, drugs, prostitution, and thefts (Rev 2:20-21).

^{10.1} Then I saw another mighty angel—*Jesus Christ*—coming down from Heaven—the *spiritual realm* (Rev 5:2). He was clothed in a cloud (Exod 16:10; Psa 104:1-4; Dan 7:13-14; Rev 1:7) with a rainbow upon his head (Gen 9:11-17; Isa 54:9-10; Ezek 1:28). His face was like the sun (Rev 1:16) and his feet were like pillars of fire (Exod 13:21-22, 14:24; Num 14:14; Dan 10:6; Rev 1:15). ² He had the small, open book of *the Creator’s Kingdom* in his hand (Rev 5:1-10). He put his right foot upon the Sea—the *chaotic realm*—and his left foot upon the Earth—the *material realm* (Psa 2:7-8, 65:5-8; Rev 4:11, 5:13). ³ He called out in a loud voice like a roaring lion—*ready to protect his creation* (Isa 31:1-5; Hos 11:10-11; Rev 5:5). When he called out the seven thunderclaps of his voice spoke (Psa 29:3-9, 104:5-9; Rev 4:5, 6:1). ⁴ When the seven thunderclaps had spoken, I was about to write it down, but I heard a voice from Heaven saying,

“Seal the things which the seven thunderclaps spoke (Isa 8:11-17; Dan 8:26, 12:4)! Do not write about them (Rev 1:11, 1:19)!”

⁵ The angel—*Jesus Christ*—which I saw standing upon the Sea and the Earth, raised his right hand into Heaven (Deut 32:40-43; Rev 1:17-20, 5:1, 5:7). ⁶ By the one living into the ages of the ages (Rev 1:18, 7:2) who created Heaven—the *spiritual realm*—and the things in it, the Earth—the *material realm*—and the things in it, and the Sea—the *chaotic realm*—and the things in it (Rev 4:11), he swore that the time would be no longer (Dan 12:5-9; Rev 1:3, 1:19, 4:1, 6:9-11). ⁷ For in the days of the voice of the seventh angel, about to blow his trumpet, the mystery of the Creator’s *Kingdom* would be complete, as he had proclaimed in the Gospel to his servants, the prophets (Amos 3:7; Rev 1:1, 6:11, 7:3). ⁸ The voice which I heard from Heaven was again speaking to me and saying,

“Go! Take the open book in the hand of *Jesus Christ* who is standing upon the Sea and the Earth (Rev 10:2).”

⁹ I went to *Jesus Christ* saying to him,

“Give me the little book of *the Creator’s Kingdom*.”

He said to me,

“Take and consume it. It will upset your stomach, but in your mouth it will be sweet as honey.”

¹⁰ I took the little book of *the Creator’s Kingdom* from the hand of *Jesus Christ* and consumed it. In my mouth it was sweet as honey—*easy to desire*—but when I ate it my stomach was upset—*for it was difficult and painful* (Deut 8:3; Job 23:12; Psa 19:9-10, 119:103; Prov 16:24; Jer 15:15-18; Ezek 2:8—3:15; Rev 3:20, 8:11). ¹¹ He said to me,

“You must again prophesy about many peoples, ethnic-groups, tongues, and rulers (Jer 1:9-10; Rev 2:26, 6:15, 7:9).”

^{11.1} He gave to me a rod like a staff (Exod 14:16; Psa 23:5, 45:6, 110:2; Ezek 20:37-38, 40:3-5; Zech 2:1-2; Rev 2:27), saying,

“Rise! Measure—*protect*—the Creator’s temple, the altar, and *the souls of* those bowing down in it (1 Kgs 19:18; Psa 11:5; Isa 10:20-22; Jer 23:3; Dan 5:26; Zeph 3:12-13; Rev 3:12, 6:9, 7:15, 8:3, 9:3).² But the courtyard outside of the temple—*their bodies*—cast it out and do not *protect* it, for it has been given to the ethnic-groups and they will trample the Holy City—*the Church*—for 42 months—*3.5 years or 7 cycles of 6 months* (Deut 5:9; Dan 7:25, 8:13-14, 12:7; Rev 3:12).³ I will direct my Two Martyrs to prophesy for 1,260 days—*3.5 years or 7 cycles of 6 months*—while clothed in heavy-cloth—*mourning the coming destruction* (Gen 37:34; Deut 19:15; Joel 1:13; Jon 3:5-10; Rev 6:12, 10:10).”

⁴ These Two Martyrs are the two olive trees and lampstands—*the Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* (Psa 52:8-9; Zech 4:1-14; Rev 1:2, 1:9, 6:9, 12:11, 12:17, 14:12, 19:10, 20:4), who stand before the Lord of the Earth.⁵ If someone wants to hurt them, fire—*the Creator’s Word*—comes out of their mouths and consumes their enemies (Psa 18:7-15; Jer 5:14; Hos 6:5; Rev 1:16, 2:16, 3:16, 9:18-19, 10:9-10). The one who wants to hurt them will be killed in this way.⁶ *The Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* have authority to shut Heaven, so that rain—*the Creator’s provision*—may not fall during the days of their prophecy (1 Kgs 17:1). *The Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* have authority over the Waters—*the chaotic realm*—to turn them into blood and to strike the Earth with every plague as often as they want (Exod 7:17, 9:14; Rev 2:26).⁷ When *the Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* have completed their martyrdom, the Monster—*the Nation*—which rises up out of the Abyss—*the spiritual prison* (Rev 9:1-2, 9:11), will war against them, conquer them, and kill them (Dan 7:19-22; Rev 2:6, 2:15, 6:2, 9:7-9).⁸ Their corpses will be on the street of the Great City—*Civilization*—which is spiritually called Sodom and Egypt, where their Lord *Jesus* was crucified (Isa 3:8-9; Jer 23:14; Ezek 16:44-52, 23:2-4).⁹ Those from the peoples, tribes, tongues, and ethnic-groups of *Civilization* see the corpses of *the Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* for 3.5 days and do not allow their corpses to be put in a tomb (Psa 79:1-3; Rev 1:7, 5:9, 7:9).¹⁰ Those dwelling upon the Earth rejoice and celebrate over this. They will send gifts to each other because these two prophets tormented those who dwell upon the Earth (Psa 25:2, 35:19-20; Rev 3:10, 8:13, 9:5).¹¹ But after 3.5 days the Spirit of life from the Creator came into them and *the Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom* stood upon their feet (Gen 2:7; Ezek 37:1-10; Rev 1:18, 2:8, 5:6). And great fear fell upon those watching (Jer 33:9; Rev 1:17, 2:10).¹² Then the Two Martyrs—*the Creator’s Narrative and Jesus’s Martyrdom*—heard a loud voice from Heaven saying to them,

“Come up here!”

And they went up into Heaven—*the spiritual realm*—on a cloud and their enemies watched them (Gen 5:24; 2 Kgs 2:1-14; Dan 7:13; Rev 1:7, 10:1).¹³ In that hour (Rev 3:3, 3:10, 8:1, 9:15) there was a great quake and a tenth of the City—*Civilization*—collapsed (Rev 6:12). And 7,000 humans were killed in the quake (1 Kgs 19:18) while the rest became afraid and gave glory to the Creator of Heaven (Jer 13:15-16; Rev 1:6, 4:11, 5:12-13, 7:12, 9:20-21).

¹⁴ The second woe has departed. Look, the third woe is quickly arriving (Rev 1:1, 2:16, 3:11, 8:13, 9:12)!
